

PREREQUISITES for PHRN & ECRN

Participants must provide current documentation of the following:

- Registered Nurse in Illinois
- Current CPR for Healthcare
- Current ACLS
- Current PHTLS or ITLS
- Current PEPP or PALS
- Resume
- If you are not in the PAEMS system you need to provide documentation that your EMS system will allow you to do your post course requirements.

COURSE COMPLETION

PHRN

1. Successfully complete the course
2. Complete your system's written protocol exam at the highest level in your system. Minimum passing score is 80%.

Taken at the end of the second day of class.

3. Minimum of 10 documented runs at the highest level in your system under the supervision of a Field Training Instructor within 90 days of completing the course.

ECRN

1. Successfully complete the course
2. Complete your system's written protocol exam at the highest level in your system. Minimum passing score is 80%.

Taken at the end of the second day of class.

3. Complete 8 hours of field experience under the supervision of a Field Training Instructor within 90 days of completing the course.

PHRN & ECRN Curriculum Preface

The PHRN/ECRN is a healthcare professional who demonstrates an understanding of pre-hospital emergency medical services. PHRN/ECRN candidates completing this curriculum will have successfully demonstrated entry-level competency in basic and advanced life support theory, inclusive of scene safety issues, field patient assessment, field patient management with continuous field monitoring, radio communication skills, basic and advanced life support psychomotor skills and field transportation issues.

This revised 'PHRN/ECRN curriculum' redefines the scope of responsibility of the PHRN/ECRN and redirects the basic information to a pre-hospital environment. PHRNs function under medical control authorization in a pre-hospital environment, working in conjunction with other pre-hospital practitioners to competently and emergently care for the patient. A critical intent of this revised curriculum is to have the registered nurse integrate pathophysiological principles with patient assessment findings to formulate a field impression, leading to the implementation of a treatment plan utilizing the Prehospital System Protocols. The ECRN will use some of these same principles to guide pre-hospital providers from a hospital setting.

The 'PHRN/ECRN Curriculum' is designed to address topics pertinent to the pre-hospital emergency care of the critically ill and injured patient and reflects the current objectives of the National Standard Curriculum as identified by the National Highway Traffic Safety Association.

The practice of a PHRN requires a unique body of knowledge, incorporating nursing knowledge with pre-hospital emergency medical care. PHRNs need to adhere to established standards of practice in addition to the application of a specific body of emergency medical services knowledge and psychomotor skills that are dynamic over time.

Registration

The registration fee is \$230.00 which includes course materials. Please get the latest copy of your systems protocol as you will be taking your protocol exam during the class. You must pass at the highest level in your system. If your internship will be in the *PAEMS System* you will take the *PAEMS ALS Exam*.

Those providers wanting to attend this course should have the registration form, all paperwork and payment to the EMS office by: **September 8, 2010**

Cancellations No refunds will be given once payment is accepted at the EMS Office. 5 or more participants are required for each class. Class will be canceled if less than 5 participants are registered. If the EMS Office cancels the course, participants will automatically be registered for the next course that is offered at the EMS Office. Non-attendance will result in the forfeiting of the course fee. Non-attendance includes cancellation with less than 24 hours notice. If registration is cancelled 24 hours or more prior to the start of the course, the participant will be enrolled in the next course offered by the EMS Office. The EMS Education Coordinator and the EMS System Manager have the ability to make exceptions to the cancellation policy.
